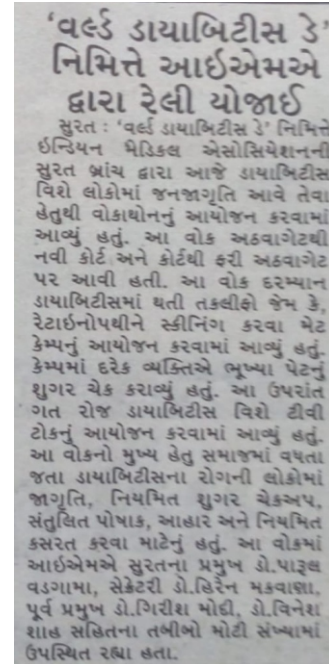

## NMC Act – 2019 and the way forward PROFESSIONAL ISSUES & IMA ACHIEVEMENTS TILL NOW & WHAT NEXT ?

### NATIONAL MEDICAL COMMISSION

Ever since a concept of NMC bill was announced by the government way back in 2015-16, IMA was on warpath. The proposed bill was drafted as per 92nd report of Parliamentary standing committee on health and Renjith Roy Choudhary committee, was primarily meant to bring in changes in regulation of medical education and medical practice. The draft bill provided for many changes in the composition of regulatory bodies, but did not have any proposals for changes in the system.

The contentious issues pointed out by IMA in the NMC draft of 2016 were:

- Loss of representational character of states including state medical councils with a predominance of government of nominated members.
- Ayush bridge course to provide for entitlement of medical practice by Ayush.
- Inclusion of non medical persons in various committees.
- NMC to regulate fee for 40% of seats in private medical colleges. Apprehension of fees remaining unregulated taking away the present mechanism of fee regulating mechanism by states.

e. NEXT exam after MBBS exam to be qualifying criteria for medical practice which will be an additional examination after university exams and internship

Following strong protest by IMA and massive campaign institutes against such provisions in the bill, introduction of bill in the parliament was delayed. Although the bill was introduced in 2017 in the Lok Sabha, it was sent to Parliamentary standing committee for further scrutiny. Indian Medical

Association submitted its proposals before PSC. All the MPs were met and sensitized. Parliamentary standing committee recommended removal of clause for bridge course, increase state representation, drop NEXT exam etc. The bill was again introduced in Lok Sabha in 2018 with cosmetic changes, but was not considered for passing and subsequently got lapsed on completion of term of the Lok Sabha.



The new government introduced NMC bill 2019 in Lok Sabha which was passed on 29th July 2019. It was passed by Rajyasabha on 1st August 2019 with amendments and our national president Dr. Santanu Sen was the lead presenter for the opposition. While most of the bills introduced during the last session were passed without discussions or amendments, NMC bill was discussed threadbare and all the points raised by IMA were voiced in the parliament by MPs. Government was forced to make the following changes in the legislation due to IMA struggle.

State representation was increased in NMC and all states and universities represented in Medical advisory council.

- Proposal for Ayush bridge dropped
- Inclusion of non medical persons in MARB and MERB limited
- Control over fee structure in 50% of seats in private medical colleges. Minister clarified in parliament that state mechanism can continue for rest of the seats.
- NEXT was converted into a common final year examination.

The main concerns of IMA in the new legislation are the clauses 32, 51 and 52

- The new concept of middle level practitioners with provision for independent practice regarding primary and preventive services. (clause 32)
- Provision for states to make appropriate measures to increase the capacity of health professionals (clause 51, 52). This clause has been specifically included to provide for Ayush bridge and similar measures at state level.
- The mode of conduct of final year exam which will be the qualifying criteria for PG courses
- In another development the implementation of provisions of the act was stayed by Delhi High Court, as the government proceeded hurriedly without formally notifying the act.
- The long struggle by IMA against NMC yielded results but we should continue our struggle to address the remaining issues.

O R D E R

Heard the learned counsel appearing for the parties.

The appellants have come up in this appeal, aggrieved by the Judgment and order dated 24.09.2008 passed by the High Court of Judicature of Bombay, Bench at Nagpur, in CrI. Writ Petition No. 482 of 2006, thereby quashing the order passed by the Sessions Court of discharging the appellants from the charges under Section 304 A read with Section 34 IPC.

The matter relates to administering medicine of Lariago. The Trial Court framed the charges after examining the witnesses. On revision being filed, the revision was allowed by the Sessions Court. The order had been questioned before the High Court. The High Court has set aside the order of the Sessions Court and restored the order of the Magistrate.

We have heard the learned counsel for the parties. Mr. Dhruv Mehta, learned senior counsel, has placed reliance on a decision of this Court in "*Jacob Mathew Vs. State of Punjab & Anr.*", reported

in (2005) 6 SCC 1. Paragraph 52 of the Judgment reads as under :-

*"52. Statutory Rules or Executive Instructions incorporating certain guidelines need to be framed and issued by the Government of India and/or the State Governments in consultation with the Medical Council of India. So long as it is not done, we propose to lay down certain guidelines for the future which should govern the prosecution of doctors for offences of which criminal rashness or criminal negligence is an ingredient. A private complaint may not be entertained unless the complainant has produced prima facie evidence before the Court in the form of a credible opinion given by another competent doctor to support the charge of rashness or negligence on the part of the accused doctor. The investigating officer should, before proceeding against the doctor accused of rash or negligent act or omission, obtain an independent and competent medical opinion preferably from a doctor in government service qualified in that branch of medical practice who can normally be expected to give an impartial and unbiased opinion applying Bolam's test to the facts collected in the investigation. A doctor accused of rashness or negligence, may not be arrested in a routine manner (simply because a charge has been levelled against him). Unless his arrest is necessary for furthering the investigation or for collecting evidence or unless the investigation officer feels satisfied that the doctor proceeded against would not make himself available to face the prosecution unless arrested, the arrest may*

*be withheld."*

As admittedly, no medical expert has been examined in this case, we set aside the impugned orders passed by the courts below and remand the case to the trial court to examine the witnesses and to take the view of the medical expert on behalf of the complainant and only thereafter, to form an opinion whether any charge is made out in the case or not. Obviously, the trial court shall not be influenced by any of the observations made by this Court or in the impugned order passed by the High Court. The matter to be decided strictly in accordance with law on the basis of the evidence and after hearing both the sides.

The appeal is allowed to the aforesaid extent.

## Important Considerations

### 1. Section 32-Community Health Provider:

- 1) The Commission may grant limited licence to practice medicine at mid-level as Community Health Provider to such person connected with modern scientific Medical profession who qualify such criteria may be specified by the regulations:

Provided that the number of limited licence to be granted under this sub-section shall not exceed one- third of the total number of licenced medical practitioners registered under sub-section (1) of section 31.

- 2) The Community Health Provider who are granted limited licences under sub-section (1), may practice medicine to such extent, in such circumstances and for such period, as may be specified by the regulations.
- 3) The Community Health Provider may prescribe specified medicine independently, only in primary and preventive healthcare, but in cases other than primary and preventive healthcare, he may prescribe medicine only under the supervision of medical practitioners registered under sub-section (1) of section 32. The concept of licensing non medical community Health Provider is dangerous. Allowing them to practice medicine independently will amount to licence to kill. It is obvious poor and marginalised will only be served by them. This is a gross injustice. The Health parameters of the country like MMR and IMR will be seriously affected.

2. State Government are now regulating the fee structure of private medical college seats. In many states 50% of the private medical seats are allotted at Government college fee structure. Only 1 5% (which is between 2 to 3 lakhs per year of the seats) of the seats are allotted to the management at an exorbitant rate of Rs. 15- 18 Lakhs per year.

NMC 2019 will allow management 50% of seats at the highest rates and even for the rest of the 50% NMC will only provide guidelines and not regulate. 279 out of 506 medical colleges in the country are in private sector and 52% of 68,000 medical seats are private. From the current state government regulated fee to the NMC 2019 poor of this country will lose 18,000 medical seats per year. The number of medical seats in the country available for purchase by the highest bidder will use to 44,000 section 10.



3. The students completing the final year of MBBS shall take a common final year examination called National Exit Test. This examination also would serve as one providing license to practice. The same examination will be the basis for selection to post graduation. The entire student community is agitated that how a low profile licentiate exam identify talent for post graduate education. Moreover it has been found that it is the students from backward classes, most backward classes, SC, ST and rural background who do not clear the 50 percent of NEET.

**Section 15(1):** A common final year undergraduate medical examination, to be known as the National Exit Test shall be held for granting licence to practice medicine as medical practitioner and for enrollment in the State Register or the National Register, as the case may be.

**Section 15(5):** The National Exit Test shall be the basis for admission to the postgraduate broad - specialist medical education in medical institutions which are governed under the provisions of this act or any other law for the time being in force and shall be done in such manner as may be specified by regulations.

4. Crosspathy/ Mixopathy: Mixing various systems of medicine at the curriculum level will effectively produce a hybrid doctor and will be the best way to a destroy the identify of Modern Medicine. So in a decade all the doctor in the country will be a product of corruption of all systems of medicine. What sort of a healthcare delivery system is in store for the future citizens of the country is oblivious. The word medical pluralism is the new terminology for Crosspatch / Mixopathy.

### Section 50:

- (1) There shall be a joint sitting of the Commission, the Central Council of Homoeopathy and the Central Council of Indian Medicine at least once a year, at such time and place as they mutually appoint, to enhance the interface between Homoeopathy, Indian Systems of Medicine and modern systems of medicine.
- 2) The agenda for the joint sitting may be prepared with mutual agreement between the chairperson of the Commission, the Central Council of Homoeopathy and the Central Council of Indian Medicine or be prepared separately by each of them.
- 3) The joint sitting referred to in sub-section (1) may, by an affirmative vote of all members present and

### Salient observations on the National Medical Commission Bill 2019

1. In section 2 at Seriatim (I) the definition of the word 'Medicine', is maintained as it was in the IMC Act, 1956.
2. In section 4 the composition of the Commission has been brought out, whereby it has a Chairperson, 10 Ex-officio Members and 14 part time members, totaling to 25. Amongst the part time members, three are on non-rotational basis and 11 are on rotational basis. In the rotational category 6 part time members would be from amongst the nominees of the States and Union Territories who are members of the Medical Advisory Council and 5 would be from nominees of the States and Union Territories who are nominated by the State Councils from amongst the elected members thereto. The term of the rotational part time members would be two years and that of the non-rotational members of part time members would be 4 years.
3. In terms of Section 6 the age of superannuation for Chairperson and members of the commission has been prescribed as 70 years.
4. In terms of proviso included in Section 7, the Government of India, has been vested with the authority to waive the binding principle of the conflict of interest.
5. In terms of section 8 (3) the Secretary of the Council would be appointed by the Government of India for a term of four years and not by the commission. The said appointment is not under the search committee as is applicable for selection in appointment of Chairperson and Members of the Commission. The Bill does not talk of any post of 'Secretary General' although the Government of India, has deputed a Secretary General on the Medical Council of India with Board of Governors thereto.
6. In terms of section 10(1) the Commission is required to frame guidelines for determination of fees and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private medical institutions and deemed to be Universities. This operationally means that only guidelines will be prescribed for charging of the fee by the private institutions and the deemed Universities. In regard to 50% of the seats however the authority of chargeability of the fee operationally stands extended to the private institutions and deemed universities for the 100% of the annual intake. Thus, it is total mortgaging to the private institutions and deemed universities giving them a free hand to charge whatever fee



- they desired fleeing the poor and the meritorious students. As such therefore the entire proposition is anti-poor and pro-rich with total surrender to the dominance of private operators in medical education.
7. Under section 11 the Advisory Council ordinarily would have 103 members including the Chairperson and 24 members of the commission including part time members each State being represented by the Vice Chancellor of Health Sciences University or where there is no health sciences University, the Vice Chancellor of the University to which maximum medical colleges are affiliated nominated by the Concerned State Govt, and one representative of each Union Territory who is the Vice Chancellor of health University in that Union Territory to be nominated by the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India. The discrimination being that the provision for nomination of Vice Chancellor of the University with maximum medical colleges affiliated in case there is no Health University as application to a State is not applicable to the Union Territory. Although it is provided that in case there is no University in any Union Territory the Ministry of Home Affairs, shall nominate a member who possesses such medical qualification and experience as may be prescribed. Yet another dichotomy would be that 29 States and 7 Union Territories would constitute 36 representative of the State as Part time members in category C and D and similar number in category E. The representation from Category C and D on to the commission is for 6 members, which would mean that the said representation accruable to a State in the context of the fact that the term is for two years would mean that the next occasion for the State to get representation would be after 12 years. Once a State or Union Territory is represented for two years on the Commission, it would remain unrepresented for a period of 12 years. Likewise, with reference to rotational representation under category E where five members would be on the Commission, the waiting period for State to get subsequent representation in the said category would be almost a period of 14 years.
  8. In terms of section 15 a National Exit Test is prescribed which would be a common final year undergraduate medical examination for granting license to practice medicine as medical practitioners and for enrolment in the State Register or the National Register. The said Exit Test would become operational on such date within three years from the date of





commencement of the said Act as may be notified by the Central Govt. People with foreign medical qualifications shall have to qualify National Exit Test for the purposes of obtaining license to practice medicine and the registration in the State register or the National Register as the case may be.

As such, every medical student after passing his final MBBS examination conducted by the examining / affiliating University for the purposes of getting license to practice medicine and entry in the State / National Medical Register as the case may be will have to clear the said National Exit Test. Thus he would be subjected to an additional examination. This Exit Test would also be availed as NEET for PG admissions, which is governed by the percentile system.

The examinee who fails to clear the National test in spite of having passed the MBBS examination and required internship would not be able to practice till he clears the said National Exit Test. This thereby defeats the very objective of the Govt, to provide greater number of trained health manpower to the extent that in the name of clearing the Exit Test as a pre-condition, those not clearing would be of no utility or use for rendering the healthcare services. Likewise, a medical graduate who otherwise by virtue of acquiring the said qualification was entitled to practice and learn his livelihood would be barred of the same till he clears the National Exit Test.

The National Exit Test also being made application to Foreign medical graduates in lieu of screening test needs to be viewed in the context to the material fact that the curriculum for the screening test is for the entire MBBS course, whereas the National Exit Test is limited to the Final MBBS examination. Thus deprives the totalistic assessment of a foreign medical graduate through National Exit Test by virtue of its limited nature. Thus it facilitates inclusion of the foreign medical graduates as registered medical practitioners on a limited testing and therefore would prove counterproductive and detrimental to the public health care system in the country.

9. In terms of Section 28 (7) the Medical Assessment and Rating Board may conduct evaluation and assessment at anytime without any prior notice to assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of medical institutions. The authority is discretionary as it is worded in the form of 'may' and not 'shall'. Further, it is in dichotomy with Section 28(1) of the Bill wherein permission from the said Board is a must for starting a



medical college or any postgraduate course including any augmentation in the existing annual intake for the ongoing courses. However, such a permission is entailed by an onsite inspection is not explicitly provided, which amounts to over liberation.

Further the explanation for defining the ambit of the term 'person' as availed in section 28(1) does not include in its ambit the word 'company' created under the Indian Companies Act.

10. In terms of section 30 of the Bill appellate jurisdiction is provided for the medical practitioner, but not to the other aggrieved party, which is patently dichotomous and un-equitable in nature.
11. Section 32 provides for a community health provider which in its operation is inconsistent with the definition of the word 'medicine' included at Section 2 (l) of the Bill.
12. In section 37(1) the provision contemplates the recognition of medical qualifications granted by statutory or 'other body' in India, which is inconsistent with the definition of the word 'University' under section 2(x) of the Bill wherein the word 'University' has to have the same meaning as is assigned to it under section 2(f) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956.
13. Under section 45 the Government of India, has empowered itself to issue binding directions on questions of policy to the Commission and the Autonomous Boards which is an anti-thesis to the concept and designation of the functional units as Autonomous.
14. Under section 46 the Central Govt, has taken on its own to issue such directions as it may deem necessary to a State Government for carrying out all or any of the provision of this Act and the State Government shall comply with such directions which is not only autocratic and anti-federal but also undermines the authority of the State Government itself.
15. Under section 55 the Central Govt, has vested itself with the power of supersession of the commission for a period not exceeding six months and a reasonable opportunity would be given to the commission to show cause as to why it should not be superseded as a part of natural justice. However, it's a matter of record that Medical Council of India came to be superseded in 2010 and 2018 respectively without any such conformity to the principles of natural justice.
